
Submission Checklist

- Authors must verify that their submission complies with all the elements shown below.
- Submissions not complying with these guidelines will be returned to the authors.
- All communication with the Journal of the Venezuelan Society of Microbiology (RSVM) both in cases of modifications, as well as decision notification, will be through the email of the Editorial Commission, revsocvenmicrobiol@gmail.com

Submission Checklist

- Authorship declaration letter signed by all authors meets all RSVM requirements
- The work has not been previously published, nor has it been submitted to another journal (or an explanation has been provided in Comments to the Editor).
- The submission file is in Microsoft Word® for Windows® format, Times New Roman font 12 points
- Title in Spanish and English
- List of authors with full names and surnames, without professional titles, indicating in each case the institution to which they belong, the email address, and the ORCID identifier (mandatory for the corresponding author).
- Includes unstructured summary in Spanish and English maximum of 200 words each.
- A summary should not be included in Letters to the Editor, Historical and/or Biographical Reviews, and critical reviews of books.
- 3 to 6 keywords are indicated in both Spanish and English, taken from the Bireme-LILACS DeCS descriptors.
- Respect the maximum word limit allowed by the RSVM, excluding title (Spanish and English), summary (Abstract, keywords and keywords), tables, figures, and references.
- It is organized as established by the Instructions to Authors.
- References are identified with Arabic numerals placed in square brackets cited in order of appearance and following Vancouver standards, including the web link, DOI, or ARK, if applicable.
- The manuscript follows good bioethical practices. Studies with humans must establish, in the description of the materials and methods, the approval of the Ethics Committee where the work was carried out. Those studies that involve animals follow the guidelines for the care and use of laboratory animals. Alternatively, if the endorsement is not available, the authors must indicate that the ethical standards consistent with the Declaration of Helsinki were respected (aspect included in the declaration of authorship).
- The authors certify they have obtained the patient's informed consent for using their images and other clinical information and have it in their possession.
- The informed consent model applied to the participants is attached.
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
